


REV West – Background

- Eight states signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) in October
 2017, addressing regional coordination on EV corridor development
- Shared goals of the MOU:
 - Creating best practices
 - Minimum standards for stations
 - Integrated infrastructure planning and development
 - Increase EV availability in states
 - Promote tourism
- Hold monthly calls with the full group, and two calls with the Voluntary Minimum Standards Working Group



Recent Actions – Since September 2018

- Baseline Policy Analysis
 - EV Purchase Incentives
 - EVSE Installation Incentives (covering commercial stations, corridor development, personal and work charging)
 - EV Procurement and Deployment in state fleets
 - Charging Rates and Regulations
 - Building Codes
 - Consumer education and marketing
 - Funding opportunities
- In-Person Meeting in Denver (October 2018)
- Request for Information
- Federal Highway Administration engagement



RFI – Voluntary Minimum Standards Working Group

- Developed a list of twenty questions to gather information on station specifics
- Ten respondents
 - Charging Companies: (ChargePoint, Greenlots, Hubject, Tritium)
 - Auto Manufacturers (Daimler, Ford, GM, Tesla)
 - Non-profits (Center for Sustainable Energy, Electric Vehicle Charging Association)
- Issues Considered:
 - Distance between stations; distance from highway
 - Standard signage requirements
 - Equipment and power requirements for stations
 - Station amenities and functions
 - Payment options and stations connectivity

REV West – Next Steps

- Voluntary Minimum Standards Working Group draft document in the works
- FHWA Outreach (February 2019 call)
 - Confusion over Title 23 Section 111, banning commercial sales at rest stops, except for vending machines
 - Draft document to coordinate with state DOTs
 - Holding a Q&A on Feb. 20th and discussing possible workarounds with FHWA staff
 - Coordinated response with other regional groups?
- Joint mapping software (March 2019 call)
- Tourism and marketing (April 2019 call)
- Other topics: Get EVs into local dealerships; Improve collection of registration data; Public transit electrification
